The Town of Providence Village has chosen Waste Management to provide residential waste services.





Dear Providence Village Resident, Waste Management is pleased to be the provider of waste services for Providence Village. Like Providence Village, Waste Management is focused on sustainability- creating, deploying, and nurturing community programs aimed at inspiring change for a greener tomorrow.

Here is some information you need to know about your new service:

- For additional questions not answered in this flyer, call Waste Management customer service at 972-315-5400.
- If your cart is lost or stolen, please file a police report and then call Waste Management for a replacement, 972-315-5400.
- There is a list of accepted recyclable materials on the lid of the cart. This will serve as a reminder. All items may be placed in the cart together, no separation is required. Please rinse all containers before placing them in the cart. Do not place an item in the cart except what is listed as acceptable.
- All household trash must be placed in the polycart with the exception of brush and bulk items. Brush and bulk is limited to one cubic yard (3ft. x 3ft. x 3ft.) per week. Brush must be in bundles weighing no more than 50 pounds and be no more than 4 feet in length and no more than 3 inches in diameter.



How the Program Works

- On Mondays, place your cart(s) and your bulk/ brush out for collection no later than 7 AM.
- Recycling service will be the same as your trash collection day, every other week on Mondays.
- After collection, remove your cart(s) from the alley or street and store in a secure and convenient location.
- Do not over fill containers; the lids must remain closed to prevent littering.
- Do not place recyclable items outside the cart.
- Do not place anything in the recycling cart that is not listed on the lid.
- Do not leave the cart(s) on the street or in the alley where it may be stolen or damaged.
